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### Course Description

This course is designed to help students interested in the medical profession build their knowledge of terminology pertinent to this field through oral, reading and written assignments. Students will not only learn terminology but will also learn about medical topics and improve communication skills. In addition, the course will examine current topics in the medical field in the US and Latin America and cover a selective grammatical review. By the end of the semester students will have acquired a lexicon of approximately 500 new words that are not found in other language acquisition classes.

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### Objectives

By the end of the semester, students will be able to:

1. Communicate appropriately in medical situations in Spanish using the present and past tenses and commands.
2. Make recommendations about medical problems or situations using the present subjunctive.
3. Ask health related questions and questions about medical history and personal information.
4. Discuss medical current topics related to Latin American and Latinos in the United States.

This class meets for a total of 150 minutes per week and therefore students should complete at least 5 hours per week of work outside of the classroom.

### **Participación**

Participation is crucial for success in this course. Class time will focus on discussing and analyzing readings, blogs, videos, grammar, etc. In order to participate effectively, it is imperative that students are prepared for class, with the assigned tasks completed. The use of cell phones or laptops for reasons unrelated to class will lower participation grades significantly.

### **Tarea**

There are two homework assignments per chapter – one vocabulary/content based assignment (due by class time on Wednesdays) and one grammar based assignment (due by class time on Fridays). All homework will be submitted on Canvas and due dates are on the schedule below.

### **Pruebas de vocabulario**

There will be 12 vocabulary quizzes over the course of the semester, one each chapter. The quizzes will be simple and will only take 5-10 minutes at the beginning of class. There will be no make-ups given for quizzes – if a student is not in class for a quiz the quiz grade will be a zero. At the end of the semester the lowest two quiz grades will be dropped.

### **Blog**

Each student will create a blog (in class on Friday, January 25) and write 12 posts over the course of the semester. In this blog students will write posts (in Spanish) about the field of medicine/ medical Spanish that interests them most. Students are encouraged to respond to other websites, articles, videos, etc. in blog posts. Blog posts are due by class time on Mondays.

### **Reacciones a los blogs**

Each chapter students are required to read blog posts of the other members of their blog group and write reaction notes to be discussed in class each Wednesday. The reaction notes will be collected after the discussion.

### **Video**

In groups of 2 or 3, students will create a video skit using vocabulary from the chapter, which will be shown in class. In addition students will create a handout of comprehension questions for the class to answer while watching the video.

### **Ensayo**

The essay will involve a variety of vocabulary and grammar topics covered during the semester and will be written in class on April 17.

## Presentación

During the final days of class students will give final presentations. The structure and topics of the final presentations will be discussed near the end of the semester.

### Attendance
